Leadership St. Vrain (LSV) was launched in the 2009-2010 school year after a group of highly engaged parents ran a successful campaign for a mill levy override and school improvement bond.

Since that time, six cohorts of parents have participated in a formal training program designed to deepen their knowledge of district operations and exchange ideas with staff, board members and state education officials.

The program is especially appropriate for parents who want to obtain a foundation in district operations and governance and become more effective participants in school district affairs.
