Course Description:

Students in preschool will study and master the Language Arts concepts of oral expression and listening, reading for all purposes, writing and composition, and research and reasoning. During learning centers and small and large group activities, preschool learners develop word study skills, vocabulary and listening comprehension to achieve an early readiness reading level by the end of the school year. In addition, preschool learners enhance pre-writing skills through fine motor activities that increase hand strength and dexterity. These concepts and associated skills are aligned with the Colorado Academic Standards for Language Arts incorporating 21st century skills and postsecondary and workforce readiness competencies.

*"Begin to" is interpreted to mean attending to or engaging with the learning task or activity.
