SUBJECT: High School Scholarships Awarded Spring 2013

<u>PURPOSE</u>

To provide the Board of Education with information relative to the local high school scholarships awarded to 2012-2013 District graduates.

BACKGROUND

Annually, a list of local scholarships is sent to District high schools to be distributed to graduating seniors. The sponsors of these scholarships range from civic organizations and local businesses to families who have set up scholarships in memory of loved ones. These awards are substantial and the generosity of this community is commendable. Students were awarded a total of \$375,169 in local scholarships and awards. In addition, students were offered a total of \$12,308,293 in scholarships and awards from colleges and universities across the country.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Education authorize the Department of Learning Services to apply for, and accept if approved, a \$1,578,544 Physical Activity Grant through the Colorado Health Foundation.

BACKGROUND

The Colorado Health Foundation believes that if kids attend a "healthy school" where they are served healthy meals, have opportunities for physical activity and access to basic health care, then they are better able to learn and maintain healthy habits into adulthood. Providing students with opportunities to participate in moderate to vigorous physical activity (MVPA) is one component of an overall healthy school, and facilitates improvement in health and fitness as well as academic achievement. The Foundation invites school districts to submit applications to increase the number of students who engage in MVPA.

The Physical Activity Grant will facilitate increased MVPA by funding (1) implementation of the 100 Mile Club before school at all elementary and K-8 schools (2) professional development for all classroom teachers regarding physical activity breaks in the classroom as well as a variety of classroom equipment and resources such as juggling scarves, fitness hotspots, bean bags, and resources on "brain breaks", and (3) recess carts with equipment such as balls, jump ropes, hula hoops, etc., that will give students more choices in the way they can be physically active during recess. Additionally, students can record their activity into WELNET, the fitness data evaluation system purchased with funds from the Physical Education Improvement Grant that SVVSD received in 2011.

Rob Berry, Director of Athletics, Fine Arts, Physical Education and Health; Paige Jennings, Physical Education Grant Coordinator; and Shelly Allen, Director of Nutrition Services, will be present to answer questions.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Education approves the accreditation recommendations for schools within the St. Vrain Valley School District.

BACKGROUND

The District Accountability/Accreditation Committee is made up of parents and community members from director districts, an elementary principal, a secondary principal, a teacher, and a charter school representative. Tori Teague also works with the Committee as a liaison from the District. The Committee met on September 10, 2013 to review the performance of the District's schools. As a result of the meeting, the Committee recommends accreditation status for schools.

The Committee follows the guidelines of SB 09-163 to recommend accreditation levels for schools. The Committee uses Colorado Department of Education's (CDE) School Performance Framework for accreditation levels of schools. The framework considers the following data areas to recommend the District's school accreditation levels: Academic Achievement, Academic Growth, Academic Growth Gaps, and Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness. One District school, Olde Columbine High School, is a CDE-approved alternative campus and uses different assessment data for the framework calculations. APEX Home School Enrichment Program is a nontraditional school and does not have the same state assessment data as other schools.

The Committee recommends District Learning Services' personnel meet with schools that are accredited with an improvement, priority improvement, or turnaround plan. At those meetings, schools are asked to answer questions about their current performance, plans to improve that performance, for any additional data that the school might have collected, and what support needs to be provided by the District. The Committee also may request to meet with schools and/or District Learning Services to discuss school improvement plans.

High School Education Foundation

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Education allow an exception to the Organizational Options for Parent Organizations Policy KBE-R, and thereby approve a waiver for the general liability insurance requirement for the Frederick High School Education Foundation.

BACKGROUND

Board Policy KBE, Relations with Parent Organizations, states, "District insurance does not cover parent organizations organized as non-profit corporations. Furthermore, the District is not liable or responsible for loss of their property or money, or the decisions made by the non-profit corporation, its board, or its officers. The non-profit corporation is encouraged to investigate and purchase appropriate officer's liability insurance, property insurance, and crime insurance (fidelity bond), in addition to the general liability insurance required by the District."

The Frederick High School Education Foundation appealed for a waiver from Policy KBE-R due to the fact that they do not use District facilities except for their meetings. These waivers are consistent with past practices and have been reviewed by the District's legal counsel. Our attorney has reviewed and agreed with the waiver as presented.

The administration recommends approval of this exception.

AGREEMENT FOR WAIVER FROM INSURANCE REQUIREMENT IN BOARD POLICY KBE-R

It is mutually agreed by the ST. VRAIN VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT RE-1J (hereinafter referred to as "District") and **Frederick High School Education Foundation**, a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Foundation"), that the general liability insurance requirement stated in District Board Policy KBE-R (Organizational Options for Parent Organizations (POs)) is waived, subject to the following limitations:

- 1. Foundation use of District facilities will be limited to Foundation Board meetings, not to exceed 20 persons.
- 2. Foundation use of District facilities will be limited to the Frederick High School IMC (library) or, in the event of a scheduling conflict, an alternative area recommended by the District Facility Scheduler.
- 3. Foundation use shall be scheduled in advance of the meeting with the District Facility Scheduler (303-652-6310) in accordance with Board Policy/Regulation KF, KF-R and KF-E (Fee Schedule for Community Use of School Facilities).
- 4. The term of this Agreement shall be for the one-year period from October 9, 2013 to June 30, 2014.
- 5. Nothing in this insurance requirement waiver should be construed as a waiver of any other section(s) of Board Policy/Regulation KBE/KBE-R.
- 6. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver by the District of any rights, immunities, privileges, monetary limitations to judgments, or defenses provided to the District by the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, Sec. 24-10-101 et seq., C.R.S., as from time-to-time amended, or otherwise available to the School District, its officers, agents, volunteers, or employees.
- 7. Venue for any and all legal action arising out of this Agreement shall lie in the District Court in and for the County of Boulder, State of Colorado, and this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of Colorado.
- 8. The mutual promises herein shall be good and sufficient consideration for this Agreement although there are no actual funds exchanged between the District and Foundation.

SUBJECT: Approval of Waiver from Policy DLB, Retirement Plans

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Education allow an exception to Board Policy DLB, Retirement Plans. This exception would enable Taylor Pruss, a District employee, to withdraw money from his AXA retirement account before he is eligible to retire.

BACKGROUND

Board Policy DLB-R, Retirement Plans, states, "Hardship withdrawals will be permitted in accordance with IRS guidelines and subject to the restrictions in the plan documents, but will trigger the cessation of contributions. Once a participant ceases contributing to a SVVSD 403(b) or 457(b) plan for any reason, he or she may not resume contributions to that plan."

Taylor Pruss appealed for a waiver from Board Policy DLB-R due to the fact that he is purchasing a home and wants to use money in his AXA account toward the down payment. Current Board Policy only allows withdrawals from the retirement account under very limited circumstances as defined in the plan documents. This is due to the fact that the District is offering these plans as a pre-tax benefit to help employees plan for a successful retirement. It was not set up as a pre-tax benefit to allow employees to save money for other purposes and delay paying taxes. The approved hardship reasons in existing policy allow for withdrawals for reasons such as unexpected medical expenses or to avoid home foreclosures.

Community Montessori School

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Education adopt a Resolution to authorize St. Vrain Community Montessori School (SVCMS) to serve grades PK-8 in accordance with the terms of the current Charter Renewal Term of ten years, which presently extends through June 2022.

BACKGROUND

On July 30, 2013, the SVCMS submitted a grade extension application to the District in order to become a PK-8 school. SVCMS intends to open the middle school in the fall of 2014 in order to serve 7th grade students, and 8th grade will be added in the fall of 2015.

The Board will be provided with copies of the application. District staff, as well as representatives of SVCMS, will be available at the meeting for discussion and to respond to questions.

APPROVING GRADE EXTENSION APPLICATION FOR ST. VRAIN COMMUNITY MONTESSORI SCHOOL

Requirements – PE Waiver

<u>PURPOSE</u>

For the Board of Education to review the proposed revisions to Board Policy IKF-R – Graduation Requirements – PE Waiver.

BACKGROUND

Revisions to this policy are necessary due to alignment with current practice, procedure, and applicable statutes and have been reviewed by District administration.

STRATEGIC PLAN CORRELATION

Graduation Requirements-Physical Education Waiver

The St. Vrain Valley School District provides the opportunity for a student to waive up to 1.0 physical education credit. All students must complete two (2) physical education credits to graduate.

Students who maintain full-time student status during all four years of high school and meet all other graduation requirements may waive <u>an initial</u>.5 physical education credit by successfully completing <u>the following criteria</u>:

- ____ Two (2) St. Vrain Valley School District athletic programs at the varsity or junior varsity level (two different sports; same sport two seasons); or
- ____ 72 hours during one semester of an appropriate, pre-approved, structured, and supervised activity outside of the school district.

Students with an advanced course schedule, including enrollment in multiple academically rigorous courses, may also request an initial .5 physical education credit waiver when combined with one of the above criteria.

Students may waive an additional .5 <u>physical education credit</u> for a total of one (1) physical education credit in this same manner.

The activities to waive physical education credit may be met during any of a student's four years of high school.

A student may not waive physical education credit if they have failed any courses and/or are in the process of credit recovery to meet graduation standards.

Students must submit a written request for a waiver to their counselor beginning in January of their junior year.

Schools will provide information regarding the physical education waiver to students and parents annually to allow time for planning.

Once the physical education waiver requirements have been met, the student will submit the application, time log, and written assessment to the building principal (including all required signatures) for verification and approval.

Whether or not a student has received a physical education waiver, they are still required to successfully complete 24.5 credits in order to earn their high school diploma.

The physical education waiver application may be acquired in the <u>counseling offices of every high</u> school's <u>counseling office</u>.
