Academic Scorecards (6.1)

Tori Teague reported that, since 2010, the District has used a Balanced Scorecard to gauge progress and needs for schools and the District overall. In 2016, we evaluated

the purpose and usefulness of the current Balanced Scorecard. After input from principals, District staff, and the Board of Education, the scorecard was re-designed to better meet the needs of schools and the District.

The new Academic Scorecard will primarily serve as a target-setting tool, and provide a visual for all staff on current academic performance and targets. Baseline data for the scorecard will be 2016 data, and the scorecard includes annual goals as well as a 2020 long-term goal. Academic Scorecards will continue to be internal working documents.

Kerri McDermid demonstrated how to load data into the new scorecard. Tori and Kerri answered questions from Board members. Board members appreciated all the work that went into the new scorecards and look forward to see them implemented.

<u>Approval of Recommendation to Hire Principal for Prairie Ridge Elementary</u> School (8.1)

Amory Siscoe moved that the Board of Education approve the recommendation to hire Ms. Jill Lliteras as the Principal for Prairie Ridge Elementary School, effective July 1, 2017. Paula Peairs seconded.

Jackie Kapushion reported that Ms. Lliteras graduated from Metropolitan State College

with a Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education. She continued her education at the University of Northern Colorado where she completed her Master of Arts in Special Education, Gifted and Talented. She later completed the Principal and Administrator Licensure Program with the University of Northern Colorado.

Ms. Lliteras has served as a Principal for Aurora Public Schools at Fulton Elementary School for nine years and at Fletcher Elementary for one year. During her time as Principal, she supported the building with full implementation of a Turnaround Improvement Grant of \$1.2 million, lead and supported the movement of the School Performance Framework from Priority Improvement to Performance in one year, and is currently serving as the President-Elect for the Colorado Association of Elementary School Principals. Ms. Lliteras has also served in leadership roles as an Assistant Principal, District Math Coach and Department Chair. Prior to those leadership roles, she served as a Gifted and Talented, Elementary and Middle School Math and Literacy Teacher. Annual salary will be according to schedule.

Ms. Lliteras was very appreciative to be here with St. Vrain and is here because of the example of the student honors she saw earlier in the Board Meeting. She introduced her husband, Dan.

John Ahrens moved that the Board of Education approve the recommendation to hire Ms. Jennifer Conrad as the Assistant Principal for the new Erie PK-8, effective July 1, 2017. Debbie Lammers seconded.

Dina Perfetti-Deany reported that Ms. Conrad graduated from Colorado State University with a Bachelor of Science in Home Economics Education and minoring in English and Human Development. She continued her education at the University of Colorado, Denver, where she completed her Master of Arts in Writing. She later completed her Colorado Principal Licensure from the University of Phoenix.

For the past four years, Ms. Conrad has served as an Assistant Principal at The Manning School in Jefferson County Public Schools. In conjunction with that, she served as the lead Principal for all middle-level Assistant Principals where she provided professional development and support for master scheduling. Prior to that, she served as the Assistant Principal at Drake Middle School in Jefferson County Public Schools for four years. Ms. Conrad has served as a teacher for fifteen years before embarking on her administrative career path. Ms. Conrad has been the recipient of the Integrity Value Award and the Exemplary Performance Value Award. Annual salary will be according to schedule.

Ms. Conrad thanked the interview committee for the warm welcome to St. Vrain. This District matches her values, and she is excited to be part of the new Erie PK-8 team. Cyrus Weinberger told the Board that it will be a real pleasure to work with Ms. Conrad, and knows she will do a great job.

Joie Siegrist moved that the Board of Education approve the recommendation to hire Ms. Sandy Heiser as the Assistant Principal for Westview Middle School, effective July 1, 2017. Dr. Richard Martyr seconded.

Dina Perfetti-Deany reported that Ms. Heiser graduated from Arizona State University with a Bachelor of Arts in Secondary Education. She continued her education at ASU where she completed her Master of Arts in Curriculum and Instruction. She later completed her Colorado Principal Licensure from Colorado State University.

Ms. Heiser has served as an Assistant Principal at Mountain View High School in Loveland for the past two years and at Bill Reed Middle School for three years prior to that. Before her administrative roles, Ms. Heiser was an instructional coach at Conrad Ball Middle School in Loveland for three years. She also served as a classroom teacher for 13 years at Glendale High School in Glendale, Arizona. Annual salary will be according to schedule.

Ms. Heiser was excited for the opportunity to join St. Vrain and Westview, and to move from high school to middle school. Mark Spencer congratulated Ms. Heiser and reiterated that SVVSD is a destination for the best and brightest in Colorado.

Debbie Lammers moved that the Board of Education approve the attached resolution proclaiming support for the Education Foundation for the St. Vrain Valley's celebratory production entitled "You're the Top!" and declaring May 5, 2017 as Tribute to Teachers Day. John Ahrens seconded.

Jackie Kapushion reported that the Education Foundation for the St. Vrain Valley (EFSVV) is an independent 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization established in 1985. The

Foundation's primary mission is to support the Strategic Plan of the St. Vrain Valley School District. As a result, their goal is to supplement the education experience in ways that maximize the effectiveness of teachers and enhance student achievement in an increasingly complex and competitive worldwide environment.

Annually, EFSVV hosts a special event to honor St. Vrain Valley teachers. This celebration, in its tenth year, includes an Encore Award Program, entertainment and dinner. This event, the 10th annual "You're the Top!" Tribute to Teachers will not only provide an opportunity to celebrate excellence in teaching but will help build funds available to enhance teaching and interactive learning technology in the classrooms.

Board member John Ahrens read the resolution.

Adoption of Resolution Proclaiming Teacher/Substitute Teacher Appreciation Week, May 1-5, 2017 (8.5)

Dr. Richard Martyr moved that the Board of Education adopt the attached proclamations in honor of Teacher Appreciation Week and Substitute Teacher Appreciation Week, May 1 -5, 2017. John Ahrens seconded.

Jackie Kapushion reported that, each year, proclaiming these dates as Teacher Appreciation Week and Substitute Teacher Appreciation Week helps to promote public awareness of the importance of the role of teachers in public schools. As much as any group of employees, the teaching staff is a valued and integral part of providing quality instruction for the students of the St. Vrain Valley School District.

Board member Debbie Lammers read the resolutions.

Approval of Solar System Power Purchase Agreement/Student Presentation (8.6)

Dr. Richard Martyr moved that the Board of Education approve the contract award for the Solar System Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) for five (5) sites, and further authorize Brian Lamer, Assistant Superintendent of Operations, to sign contract documents with Advanced Energy Systems LLC and initiate engineering, feasibility assessment and system installations. John Ahrens seconded.

On January 11, 2017, the Board of Education reviewed and approved moving forward with the general scope of the solar project and the direction for pursuing the solar

systems. Brian Lamer introduced Dara Ward, Energy & Sustainability Manager, who told of how the project was started. She introduced Student Solar Committee members Kimberly Fung and Mason Williams and industry leader Tim Olsen of Advanced Energy Systems. The students shared slides of information gathered from their research and the District Solar System Initiative. This project started in June 2015, and they anticipate renewable energy expansion and an average economic benefit of an annual savings of \$33,000.

The proposed rooftop systems are as follows:

- Red Hawk Elementary; 250 KW
- Niwot High School; 500 KW
- Niwot Elementary; 250 KW
- Erie Elementary; 200 KW
- Erie Middle; 500 KW

Per the agreement, the District will pay \$.035 per kWh generated from the solar projects with a 0% escalator over 20 years. The estimated total cost of energy for the five sites is \$2.57M if we do not enter into this agreement. Under the PPA, the estimated total cost of energy for the 5 sites is \$1.77M over the 20-year life, saving the District roughly \$800,000.

<u>Approval of Change Order 1 to Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC)</u> Contract for Erie PK-8 Project (8.7)

John Ahrens moved that the Board of Education approve Change Order 1 for \$26,995,215 to the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC) contract with FCI Constructors, Inc., for the Erie PK-8 Project for a \$41,995,215 contract value including contingency. Further, that the Board authorize Brian Lamer, Assistant Superintendent of Operations, to sign contract documents and initiate scope changes in accordance with Board of Education policy. Amory Siscoe seconded.

Brian Lamer reported that, on January 11, 2017, the Board of Education approved Phase I of the Erie PK-8 project with FCI Constructors, Inc., for a Phase 1 contract value of \$15,000,000. The final project includes a 133,000 sq. ft. PK-8 school to accommodate student growth, capacity impacts, and additional programming for intensive needs. Change Order 1 sets the overall project contract value. This project is funded under the 2016 Bond.

<u>Approval of Request to Grant Exception to Staff Ethics/Conflict of Interest, Board Policy GBEA (8.8)</u>

Dr. Richard Martyr moved that the Board of Education allow an exception to the current Staff Ethics/Conflict of Interest, Board Policy GBEA. This exception would enable Eric Ottem to perform with his jazz band at the St. Vrain Valley School District Retirement Dinner on May 11, 2017. Joie Siegrist seconded.

Greg Fieth reported that Board Policy GBEA, Staff Ethics/Conflict of Interest, states, "No school district employee or firm owned by a school district employee shall be allowed to sell to the district or its schools or staff goods or services of any kind without express prior written consent of the Board of Education."

Eric Ottem is employed by the District as an Assistant Principal at Silver Creek High School. He is also in a jazz band-Eric Ottem Jazz Quartet. He has offered his band's service to perform at the 2017 St. Vrain Valley School District Retirement Dinner.

Since Mr. Ottem is an employee and also a member of a band, we are requesting a waiver from Policy GBEA so we can pay him \$200 that he can distribute to his bandmates for their performance on May 11, 2017.

Approval of High School Math Adoption (8.9)

Dr. Richard Martyr moved that the Board of Education approve the adoption and purchase of *Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Algebra 1-Geometry-Algebra 2*, Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, 2015, *Elementary Statistics: Picturing the World (6th Ed.), Stats: Modeling the World (4th Ed.), Trigonometry (11th Ed.)*, Pearson, and *Calculus of a Single Variable, AP Updated Edition (10th Ed.), Precalculus with Limits: A Graphing Approach (7th Ed.), Fundamentals of Algebraic Modeling (6th Ed.)*, Cengage, for high school mathematics; and, that the Board of Education approve a purchase contract to Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, not-to-exceed \$728,000.00; a purchase contract to Pearson, not-to-exceed \$219,000.00; and a purchase contract to Cengage, not-to-exceed \$266,000.00, for these textbooks and materials in FY17, based on the estimated student enrollment for 2017-2018. They have also budgeted \$25,200.00 for staff training for initial professional development. Amory Siscoe seconded.

Greg George reported that, during the fall of 2015, an adoption committee made up of middle school mathematics teachers, high school mathematics teachers, Learning Services personnel, and administrators from across the District was formed to evaluate high school mathematics materials, pilot the selected materials, and recommend materials for adoption by the St. Vrain Valley Board of Education. The committee reviewed the Colorado Academic Standards, current District curriculum, and current

effective teaching practices in mathematics. Utilizing these resources, the committee developed an evaluation form for high school mathematics materials.

Materials were solicited from eight publishers for initial review and consideration, providing diversity in approaches and philosophy. Publisher presentations were conducted for four of the candidate programs for Algebra 1-Geometry-Algebra 2, and a final selection was made for pilot. Eleven teachers volunteered to pilot for Algebra 1-Geometry-Algebra 2, and sixteen teachers volunteered to pilot one of the textbooks for the electives courses for the 2016-2017 school year, representing every high school.

Input was gathered from pilot teachers, students, parents, non-pilot teachers, and the community. After selecting a pilot program, piloting the program for a school year, and gathering input about the selection, the committee recommends *Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Algebra 1-Geometry-Algebra 2*, *Stats: Modeling the World (4th Ed.), Elementary Statistics: Picturing the World (6th Ed.), Trigonometry (11th Ed.), Calculus of a Single Variable, AP Updated Edition (10 Ed.), Precalculus with Limits: A Graphing Approach (7th Ed.), and Fundamentals of Algebraic Modeling (6th Ed.)*, to the St. Vrain Valley Board of Education for adoption.

SVVSD Math Coordinator Greg George introduced instructors Ellie Decker from Westview; Ted Miyasaki from Timberline PK-8; Paige Gebert from Longmont High; and Sheli Mares from Frederick High School who shared their experiences piloting the product in their classrooms.

Debbie Lammers moved that the Board of Education approve the adoption and purchase of *Discovery Education* for middle school social studies; and, that the Board of Education approve a purchase contract to Discovery Education for these digital licenses not-to-exceed \$411,040.00 in FY17, based on the estimated student enrollment for 2017-2018. They have budgeted \$36,000.00 for staff training for initial professional development to cover the estimated cost of teacher extra duty pay. John Ahrens seconded.

Jenny Pettit reported that, during the fall of 2015, an adoption committee made up of middle school social studies teachers and administrators from across the District was formed to evaluate middle school social studies programs, pilot the selected program, and recommend a program for adoption by the St. Vrain Valley Board of Education. The committee reviewed the Colorado Academic Standards, current District curriculum, and current effective teaching practices in social studies. Utilizing these resources, the committee developed an evaluation form for middle school social studies programs.

Materials were solicited from six publishers for initial review and consideration, providing diversity in approaches and philosophy. Publisher presentations were conducted for three of the candidate programs, and a final selection was made for pilot. Sixteen teachers volunteered to pilot for the 2016-2017 school year, representing District middle school that will implement **Discovery Education** and every grade level.

Input was gathered from pilot teachers, students, parents, non-pilot teachers, and the community. After selecting a pilot program, piloting the program for a school year, and gathering input about the selection, the committee recommends *Discovery Education* to the St. Vrain Valley Board of Education for adoption.

SVVSD Social Studies Coordinator Jenny Pettit introduced instructors Lyle Tucker from Sunset Middle School; and Anna Youngs from Mead Middle School who shared their experiences piloting the product in their classrooms.

John Ahrens seconded.

Michael O'Toole reported that, during the fall/spring of 2015/2016, an instructional materials adoption committee made up of ten high school teachers and two members of District Technology Services from across the District representing all high school grades was formed to evaluate Earth science high school science programs, pilot the selected program, and recommend a program for adoption by the St. Vrain Valley Board of Education. The committee reviewed the Colorado Academic Standards, current District curriculum, the Learning Technology Plan and current effective teaching practices in science. Utilizing these resources, they developed an evaluation form for high school Earth science programs.

Materials were solicited from six publishers for initial review and consideration, providing diversity in approaches and philosophy. Publisher presentations were conducted for the final three candidate programs, and a final selection was made for the pilot. Three teachers volunteered to pilot for the 2016-2017 school year representing Niwot and Frederick High Schools.

SVVSD Science Coordinator Michael O'Toole introduced Niwot High School instructor Kane Hollins who shared his experience in piloting the product in his classroom.
