SUBJECT: 2016 Bond Activity Update

PURPOSE

To provide the Board of Education with an update of the 2016 Bond activity.

BACKGROUND

Voters approved the 2016 \$260.3 million Bond program in November of 2016. To date, the District has encumbered approximately \$130 million worth of projects, putting the bond at 51% complete by summer of 2018. The first phase of the bond mainly focused on projects to help mitigate capacity concerns in the Erie, Tri-Town, and Silver Creek feeders. Additional projects are underway to help enhance safety and security, educational programs, and building preservation items.

Currently, the District is working on the following projects:

- Erie Feeder: New Soaring Heights PK-8 opening late summer of 2018.
 Erie High School-20 classrooms and Lyceum addition, and parking lot capacity increase opening late summer of 2018. Completed new track at Erie Middle School.
- Tri-Town area: New Grand View Elementary PK-5 is near completion.
- Lyons: Lyons Elementary classroom addition and interior renovation in progress for fall 2018 completion.
- Frederick Feeder: Security entrance upgrades to Legacy and Prairie Ridge Elementary Schools in progress for late summer 2018 completion.
- Mead Feeder: Mead High School-20 classroom addition, site and bleacher upgrades in progress for late summer of 2018 completion.

- Niwot Feeder: Niwot Elementary new security entrance, new bus loop and parent drop off reconfiguration in progress for completion late summer 2018. Niwot High School design near complete for a major remodel to enhance the Library/Student Commons and address capacity needs, for completion fall of 2019.
- Skyline Feeder: Secure entries and building additions are in progress at Alpine and Fall River Elementary schools for completion late summer 2018.
- Silver Creek Feeder: Secure entries and building additions are complete at Blue Mountain and Eagle Crest Elementary schools. Silver Creek High School's science classroom addition and interior renovation is underway and scheduled for completion late summer 2018.
- Innovation Center: Construction is near 60% complete for a projected opening fall of 2018.
- District-Wide: Elementary security cameras have been installed and will be in operation by end of this school year. Project includes interior and exterior cameras.
- Aspen Ridge Charter: New gym/cafeteria under construction and scheduled for completion late summer 2018.
- Remaining Academy School Projects were completed summer 2017.

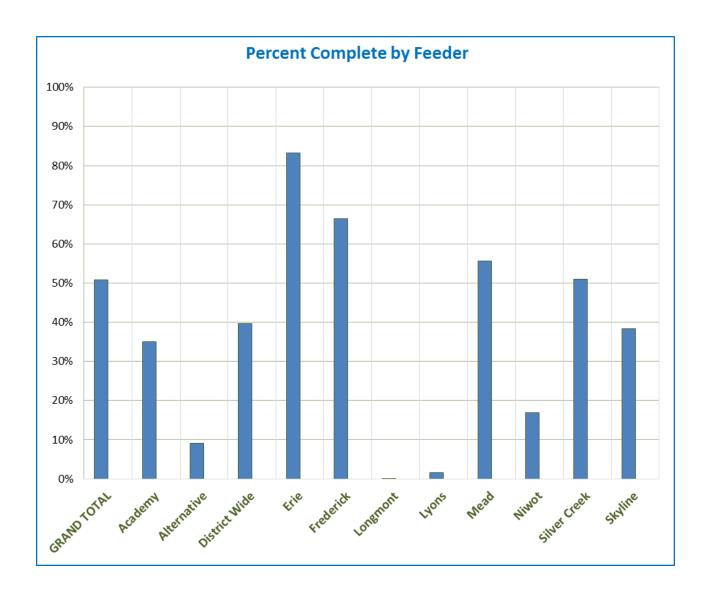

FUND ACCOUNTING

The District uses funds to report its financial position and changes in financial position. Fund accounting is designed to demonstrate legal compliance and to aid financial management by segregating transactions related to certain government functions or activities. A fund is a separate accounting entity with a self-balancing set of accounts.

Funds are classified into three categories: governmental, proprietary, and fiduciary. Each category, in turn, is divided into separate "fund types".

Governmental funds are used to account for all or most of a government's general activities, including the servicing of long-term debt (debt service fund), the construction of new schools (capital projects fund), and the collection and disbursement of earmarked funds (special revenue funds). The District's governmental funds consist of the following: General Fund; Colorado Preschool Program Fund and Risk Management Fund, both subfunds of the General Fund; Bond Redemption Fund; Building Fund; Capital Reserve Capital Projects Fund; and five special revenue funds, including the Government Designated -Purpose Grants Fund.

<u>Proprietary Funds</u> focus on the determination of the changes in net assets, financial position, and cash flows and are classified as either enterprise or internal service. Enterprise funds may be used to account for any activity for which a fee is charged to external users for goods or services. The District does not have an enterprise fund. Internal service funds account for the financing of services provided by one department to other departments of the District on a cost reimbursement basis. The District's only internal service fund is the *Self Insurance Fund*.

<u>Fiduciary Funds'</u> reporting focuses on net assets and changes in net assets. The fiduciary fund category is split into four classifications: pension trust funds, investment trust funds, private-purpose trust funds, and agency funds. Trust funds are used to account for assets held by the District under a trust agreement for individuals, private organizations, or other governments and are therefore not available to support the District's own programs. The *Student Scholarship Fund* is the District's only trust fund. Agency funds are custodial in nature (assets equal liabilities) and do not involve measurement of results of operations. The District's only agency fund is the *Student Activity Fund*.

GOVERNMENTAL FUNDS

General Fund

The <u>General Fund</u> is the District's general operating fund and is used to account for all financial transactions except those required to be accounted for in another fund. Major revenue sources include local property taxes, specific ownership taxes, and State of Colorado equalization funding, as determined by the School Finance Act of 1994, as amended. Expenditures include all costs associated with the daily operation of the schools, except for programs funded by grants from federal and state governments, school construction, certain capital outlay expenditures, debt service, food service operations, extracurricular athletic and other pupil activities, and insurance transactions.

The <u>Colorado Preschool Program Fund</u> is reported as a sub-fund of the General Fund. Moneys allocated to this fund from the General Fund are used to pay the costs of providing preschool services directly to qualified at-risk children enrolled in the District's preschool program pursuant to C.R.S. 22-28-102.

The <u>Risk Management Fund</u> is also a sub-fund of the General Fund. Moneys allocated to this fund from the General Fund are used to account for the payment of loss or damage to the property of the District, workers' compensation, property and liability claims, and the payment of related administration expenses.

GOVERNMENTAL FUNDS

Major Governmental Funds

The <u>Bond Redemption Fund</u> is a debt service fund. It is used to account for the accumulation of resources for, and the payment of, general long-term debt principal and interest. The fund's primary revenue source is local property taxes levied specifically for debt service.

The <u>Building Fund</u> is a capital projects fund that is used to account for the proceeds of bond sales and expenditures for capital outlay for land, buildings, improvements of grounds, construction of buildings, additions or remodeling of buildings or initial, additional and replacement of equipment.

Nonmajor Governmental Fund

The <u>Capital Reserve Capital Projects Fund</u> is used to account for revenue allocations from the General Fund and other revenues allocated to or earned in this fund, and the expenditures for the ongoing capital needs of the District, such as acquisition of land, building additions and improvements, and equipment purchases where the estimated unit cost is in excess of \$1,000.

GOVERNMENTAL FUNDS

Major Special Revenue Fund

The <u>Governmental Designated-Purpose Grants Fund</u> is used to account for restricted state and federal grants including, but not limited to, Title I Part A – Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged; Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA Part B); and Race to the Top.

Nonmajor Special Revenue Funds

The <u>Community Education Fund</u> is used to record the tuition-based activities including driver's education, summer school, child care, enrichment, and preschool, as well as facility use rental income.

In accordance with intergovernmental agreements, the <u>Fair Contributions Fund</u> is used to collect money for the acquisition, development, or expansion of public school sites based on impacts created by residential subdivisions.

The <u>Nutrition Services Fund</u> accounts for the food service operations of the District. Nutrition Services provides quality, nutritious and well balanced meals to students throughout District schools.

The <u>Student Activity Fund</u> is used to record financial transactions related to school sponsored pupil intrascholastic and interscholastic athletic and other related activities. Revenues of this fund are primarily from student fees, gate receipts, and gifts.

He has offered his services to provide video broadcasts of co-curricular and extracurricular events, and secure sponsorships and advertising agreements to offset the costs of video productions for Erie High School for the 2017-18 school year.

Since Mr. Bird is a teacher in the District and also produces video broadcasts, we are requesting a waiver from Board Policy GBEA so we can utilize his services.

The administration recommends approval of this exception, which shall not exceed \$5,000 for the current school year.

Further authorization is requested for Greg Fieth, Chief Financial Officer, or designee, to sign all necessary contract documents once the above steps have been completed.

BACKGROUND

Purchasing and DTS staff issued Request for Proposal (RFP) 2018-031 on December 13, 2017. Ten responses were received for consideration. Four finalists were selected to provide an interview and product presentation with the evaluation team. Konica Minolta provided the most advantageous solution to the District. The costs to the District for the five-year agreement period will be approximately \$1,756,995 based on an estimated annual copy volume of 43 million copies. The District will make a significant down payment to further reduce the cost to the District.

The successful supplier is required to provide and install new multi-function copiers District-wide to replace the current Toshiba copiers originally installed in 2013. Copy control usage measures with supplier performance criteria will be in place to monitor contract costs and maintain accountability.

BACKGROUND

The Purchasing Department staff issued Request for Qualifications (RFQ) 2018-019 on October 5, 2017 to establish a pre-qualified list of skilled, professional and dedicated educational furniture suppliers to provide FF&E who, through a direct contracting arrangement, can meet a majority of furniture requirements for the District's bond construction projects.

Ten responses were received for consideration. All suppliers participated in a product demonstration and interview session with the evaluation team. The result of this extensive effort is that the District determined a limited number of suppliers considered as pre-qualified to receive an invitation to provide a pricing proposal according to all terms and conditions and evaluation criteria indicated in the RFQ process.

The District determined BC Interiors the top finalist to negotiate a contract to provide, deliver and install the required furnishings in a cost-effective, competitive and timely manner. BC Interiors is recommended for award for the project based on their experience, proposed team, having resources available internally to provide the required products/solutions, delivery and installation within mandated time frames, and most advantageous pricing proposal.

The successful supplier is required to provide turnkey services to include, but not limited to, assigning a key contact person to be in continual communication with Purchasing

staff; coordinating final furniture selection; coordination of warehousing and/or prestaging services; coordinating delivery/install sub-contractors during various phases of the project; attendance of progress meetings; receiving and reviewing layout design drawings and related submittals before forwarding to the District; assuring compliance with contract specifications; maintaining current cost data and reporting to the District on a regular basis in order to maintain accountability for project cost; create, maintain and update project master delivery schedules, assisting in the processing of requests for payment; recording the progress of the project and maintaining an accurate record of punch list items as coordinated with the District.
