SUBJECT: Summary of Summer 2018 Construction Activities

# **PURPOSE**

To provide the Board of Education with a summary of the summer of 2018 construction activities over \$100,000 or over Board-approved amounts.

# **BACKGROUND**

On February 14, 2018, the Board approved the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC) contract with Haselden Construction LLC for the District-Wide Track Resurfacing project for \$871,036.

Change Orders 1-3 were approved and increased the total contract value \$1,269,640.

Change Order 4 included the scope of work to correct the unforeseen deterioration of the Erie High School track asphalt surface during resurfacing operations due to failing subgrade conditions. The work will improve the de-watering system, stabilize the failing subgrade, and install a new asphalt surface. This effort will reduce exposure to future deterioration of the asphalt surface and extend the useful life of the track. This Change Order for the amount of \$550,000 brings the total contract value to \$1,819,640.

Change Order 4 is funded under the Capital Reserve Fund. This item is being brought forth to comply with Board policy FEH stating any items over \$99,999 must have Board approval.

# **Public Participation at School Board Meetings**

All regular and special meetings of the Board shall be open to the public. Because the Board desires to hear the viewpoints of all citizens throughout the district and also needs to conduct its business in an orderly and efficient manner, it shall schedule time during some Board meetings for brief comments and questions from the public. Some public comment periods may relate to specific items on the agenda. The Board shall set a time limit on the length of the public participation time and a time limit for individual speakers.

During times of general public comment at a regular meeting, comments and questions may deal with any topic related to the Board's conduct of the schools. Comments at special meetings must be related to the call of the meeting. During times of public comment on specific agenda items, comments shall be confined to the topic of the agenda item being considered by the Board. Speakers may offer such criticism of school operations and programs as concern them, but are encouraged to exercise their speech rights responsibly. The Board encourages the discussion of all personnel matters to be conducted in executive session.

The Board president shall be responsible for recognizing all speakers who shall properly identify themselves, for maintaining proper order and for adherence to any time limits set. Questions asked by the public that require furthershall, when possible, be answered immediately by the president or referred to staff members present for reply. Questions requiring investigation may shall be referred to the superintendent or superintendent's designee for consideration and later response.

Members of the public will not be recognized by the president during Board meetings except as noted in this policy.

Members of the public wishing to make formal presentations before the Board should make arrangements in advance with the Board of Education secretary so that such presentations, when appropriate, may be scheduled on the agenda.

In addition to public participation time during Board meetings, the Board is committed to engaging members of the community on an ongoing basis regarding community values about education during times other than the Board's regular meetings.

### **Financial Administration**

With respect to the actual, ongoing financial condition and activities of the district, the superintendent shall not cause or allow fiscal jeopardy or a material deviation from the annual budget or any budget policies adopted by the Board, or any fiscal condition that is inconsistent with achieving the district's objectives.

# Reporting to Board and community

### **Audits**

All district funds and accounts shall be audited by an independent auditor annually in accordance with state law and Board policy concerning the annual audit. Timely and appropriate corrective actions shall be taken in accordance with any internal or external audit findings.

The Board shall receive all audit reports and be informed of all corrective actions taken.

### **Financial reports**

The superintendent or designee shall prepare and submit to the Board a quarterly financial report of all district funds. The quarterly report shall include all reporting elements required by state statute.

The format and basis for reporting shall be consistent with the adopted budget and the past year's generally accepted accounting procedures results.

The Board shall receive all financial reports in a timely manner and be informed of all corrective actions taken.

The superintendent or designee shall conduct quarterly financial reviews with the Board using reports described above.

The Board may request other financial reports as needed.

### Oral notification

The superintendent shall assure that immediate verbal notification be given to the Board regarding any potential financial problem or any matter that may affect the district's financial condition or ability to achieve its mission.

### Available to public

All f inancial and audit reports shall be made available to the public and shall be posted online as required and in accordance with the Public School Financial Transparency Act.

# Record keeping

Complete and accurate financial records shall be kept for all district funds and accounts.

# **Employee reporting**

# **Drug and Alcohol Testing for CDL Drivers**

Drivers who operate a district motor vehicle requiring a commercial driver's license are subject to a drug and alcohol testing program that fulfills the requirements of the federal regulations.

These district regulations reflect several requirements of the federal drug testing regulations but are not intended in any way to modify or limit the procedures for drug and alcohol testing specifically addressed in federal regulation. District personnel will adhere to the detailed provisions of federal regulation in administering the district's drug and alcohol program.

References to *tests* in these regulations include both drug and alcohol tests unless the context specifies otherwise. The terms *drugs* and *controlled substances* are interchangeable and have the same meaning and refer to marijuana (THC), cocaine, opioidsopiates, phencyclidine (PCP) and amphetamines (including methamphetamines). The term "opioids" includes hydrocodone, hydromorphone, oxycodone, oxymorphone, opium, opiate, or an opium derivative such as morphine, codeine or heroin.

### **Pre-employment tests**

A drug test will be administered before a driver performs any safety sensitive functions for the district.

Drug tests will be required of an applicant only after the position has been offered. Employment with the district is conditional upon the applicant receiving a negative drug test result.

An employee may be exempt from the pre-employment drug test if the employee has participated in a drug testing program within 30 days prior to the application for employment and while participating in that program either was tested for drugs within the last six (6) months (from the date of application) or participated in a random drug testing program in the previous 12 months, provided that the district has been able to make all verifications required by law.

### Post-accident tests

Alcohol and controlled substance tests will be conducted as soon after an accident as practicable on any driver who:

- 1. Was performing safety sensitive functions with respect to the vehicle if the accident involved loss of human life; or
- 2. Received a citation under state or local law for a moving traffic violation arising from the accident; or
  - a. Any party in the accident required immediate medical attention away from the scene.
  - There was disabling damage to any motor vehicle requiring tow-away.

No driver involved in an accident may use alcohol for eight hours after the accident or until after undergoing a post-accident alcohol test, whichever occurs first.

If an alcohol test is not administered within two hours or if a drug test is not administered within 32 hours after the accident, the district will prepare and maintain records explaining why the test was not conducted.

Tests conducted by authorized federal, state or local officials will fulfill post-accident testing requirements provided they conform to applicable legal requirements and are obtained by the district. Breath tests will validate only the alcohol test and cannot be used to fulfill controlled substance testing obligations.

Before any driver operates a commercial motor vehicle, the district will provide post-accident procedures that will make it possible to comply with post-accident testing requirements.

#### Random tests

Tests will be conducted on a random basis at unannounced times throughout the year. Random tests for alcohol will be conducted just before, during or just after the performance of safety sensitive functions. Random tests for drugs do not have to be conducted in immediate time proximity to performing safety sensitive functions. Once notified of selection for drug testing, a driver must proceed to a collection site to provide a urine specimen.

Drivers will be selected by a scientifically valid random process, and each driver will have an equal chance of being tested each time selections are made. The number of drivers selected for random testing will be in accordance with federal regulations.

#### Reasonable suspicion tests

Tests must be conducted when a properly trained supervisor or district official has reasonable suspicion that the driver has violated the district's alcohol or drug prohibitions. This reasonable suspicion must be based on specific, contemporaneous, articulable observations concerning the driver's appearance, behavior, speech or body odors. The observations may include indications of chronic and withdrawal effects of controlled substances.

Alcohol tests will be authorized for reasonable suspicion only if the required observations are made during, just before or just after the period of the workday when the driver must comply with alcohol prohibitions. If an alcohol test is not administered within two hours of a determination of reasonable suspicion, the district will prepare and maintain a record explaining why this was not done. Attempts to conduct alcohol tests will terminate after eight (8) hours.

An alcohol test may not be conducted by the person who determines that reasonable suspicion exists to conduct such a test.

A supervisor or district official who makes a finding of reasonable suspicion also must make a written record of his or her observations leading to a reasonable suspicion drug test within 24 hours of the observed behavior or before the results of the drug test are released, whichever is earlier.

#### Return-to-duty tests

A drug or alcohol test will be conducted when a driver who has violated the district's drug or alcohol prohibition returns to performing safety sensitive duties.

Employees whose conduct involved misuse of drugs may not return to duty in a safety-sensitive function until the return-to-duty drug test produces a verified negative result.

Employees whose conduct involved alcohol may not return to duty in a safety sensitive function until the return-to-duty alcohol test produces a verified result that meets federal and district standards.

#### Records

Employee drug and alcohol test results and records will be maintained under strict confidentiality and released only in accordance with law. Upon written request, a driver will receive copies of any records pertaining to the driver's use of drugs or alcohol, including any records pertaining to personal drug or alcohol tests. Records will be made available to a subsequent employer or other identified persons only as expressly requested in writing by the driver.

#### **Notifications**

Each driver will receive educational materials that explain the requirements of the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 49, Part 382, together with a copy of the district's policy and regulations for meeting these requirements. Representatives of employee organizations will be notified of the availability of this information. The information will identify:

- 1. The person designated by the district to answer driver questions about the materials.
- 2. Categories of drivers who are subject to the drug and alcohol testing requirements.
- 3. Sufficient information about the safety sensitive functions performed by drivers to make clear for what period of the work day driver compliance is required.
- 4. Specific information concerning driver conduct that is prohibited.
- Circumstances under which a driver will be tested for drugs and/or alcohol.
- 6. Procedures that will be used to test for the presence of drugs and alcohol, protect the driver and the integrity of the testing processes, safeguard the validity of test results and insure that test results are attributed to the correct driver.
- 7. The requirement that a driver submit to drug and alcohol tests administered in accordance with federal regulations.
- 8. An explanation of what constitutes a refusal to submit to a drug or alcohol test and the attendant consequences.

9. Consequences for drivers found to have violated the drug and alcohol prohibitions including the requirement that the driver be removed immediately from safety sensitive functions.

- 10. Consequences for drivers found to have an alcohol concentration of 0.02 or greater but less than 0.04.
- 11. Information concerning the effects of drugs and alcohol on an individual's health, work and personal life; external and internal signs and symptoms of a drug or alcohol problem; and available methods of intervening when a drug or alcohol problem is suspected including confrontation, referral to an employee assistance program and/or referral to administrative officials.

Each driver must sign a statement certifying receipt of a copy of the above materials.

The district will inform drivers before drug and alcohol tests are performed.

The district will notify a driver of the results of a pre-employment drug test if the driver requests such results within 60 calendar days of being notified of the disposition of his employment application.

The district will notify a driver of the results of random, reasonable suspicion and postaccident drug tests if the test results are verified positive. The district also will tell the driver which controlled substances were verified as positive.

Drivers will inform their supervisors if at any time they are using a controlled substance which their physician has prescribed for therapeutic purposes. Such a substance may be used only if the physician has advised the driver that it will not adversely affect his ability to safely operate a commercial motor vehicle.

#### Disciplinary procedure and enforcement

- 1. Drivers subject to the requirements of this regulation who come forward voluntarily for assistance with controlled substance use or alcohol misuse prior to being asked to take a controlled substance or alcohol test pursuant to this regulation, shall not be subject to termination from their employment with the district merely for disclosing their need for assistance. However, the driver will be removed from performing safety sensitive functions immediately, and will not be allowed to return to a safety sensitive function until the driver has been evaluated by a substance abuse professional, has complied with any treatment plan recommended by a substance abuse professional, and a determination has been made by the substance abuse professional that the driver may return to the safety sensitive function. Drivers who voluntarily come forward for assistance will be subject to return-to-duty and follow-up testing in accordance with applicable federal regulations.
- 2. When a driver has an alcohol test result of greater than 0.02, but less than 0.04, the driver will be removed from the performance of a safety sensitive function for 24 hours, but no further action will be taken against the driver based upon this information alone. Absences due to test results as described becomes a performance issue and will be treated as follows:

1st Absence: Employee may use annual leave or vacation.

2nd Absence: Personal leave (unpaid).

3rd Absence: Recommended termination.

3. When a driver has a confirmed alcohol test result of greater than 0.04, or has a verified positive test result for controlled substance use, the driver shall be removed from the safety sensitive position immediately. All drivers who test positive for controlled substances or have an alcohol test result of greater than 0.04 must be evaluated by a substance abuse professional to determine whether the driver is in need of rehabilitation services.

- 4. Drivers who test positive for controlled substances or have an alcohol test result of greater than 0.04 will also be terminated from employment with the district.
- 5. A driver who refuses to be tested for alcohol or controlled substances will be terminated from employment with the district.
- 6. The following are additional grounds for immediate termination from employment with the district, but are not connected to the Federal Highway Administration Rule:
  - a. drivers convicted of selling alcohol or controlled substances on district owned or leased property;
  - b. drivers convicted of a felony involving off-site sale or distribution of controlled substances while employed by the district.
- 7. Penalty provisions of the Federal Highway Administration Rule (Rule) provide that fines may be assessed against a driver for conduct in violation of the Rule. Civil penalty fines may be imposed where the driver's conduct is found to be grossly negligent or with reckless disregard for safety. Criminal penalties may be imposed against a driver where the driver's actions while operating a commercial motor vehicle led or could have led to death or serious bodily injury.

# Equivalence of Services (Title I)

<u>Pursuant to federal law, school districts receiving Title I funds to provide educational services to students must do so in accordance with Title I of the Every Student Succeeds Act.</u>

Title I funds shall be used to provide educational services to supplement the educational services provided for district students with state and local funds. By adoption of this policy, the district ensures equivalence among its schools in teachers, administrators and other staff and equivalence in the provision of curriculum materials and instructional supplies.

District personnel shall establish written procedures which include a process to demonstrate that Title I funds are used to provide services in school attendance areas that are at least comparable to the services provided through state and local funds in attendance areas not receiving Title I funds. Such procedures shall also require the maintenance of appropriate records documenting compliance with this policy and the updating of such records on a biennial basis.

# Complaint Procedures and Regulations Regarding the Use of Restraint or Seclusion, 1 CCR 301-45, 2620-R-2.07

According to applicable rules of the Colorado State Board of Education, the following represents the process that must be followed when a student or the student's parent/guardian wishes to file a complaint about the use of restraint or seclusion by a district employee.

- 2.07(1) A student or a parent or legal guardian may file a complaint about the use of restraint or seclusion used by an employee or volunteer of a school or charter school of [a] school district or Board of Cooperative Services or any institute charter school by using the procedures established under this section 2.07.
- <u>2.07(2)</u> Required Content of the Complaint: The Complaint must contain the following information:
  - 2.07(2)(a) A statement that the employee or volunteer has violated a requirement regarding the use of restraints and an identification of the portion of the statute, rule, or regulation alleged to have been violated, if known by the complainant;
  - <u>2.07(2)(b)</u> The background information and facts on which the Complaint is based that identify persons, actions and/or omissions;
  - <u>2.07(2)(c)</u> The name and the residential address of the child against whom the alleged violation occurred;
  - 2.07(2)(d) The name of the school that the child was attending when the alleged violation occurred;
  - <u>2.07(2)(e)</u> A proposed resolution of the problem to the extent known and available to the complainant at the time the Complaint is filed;
  - 2.07(2)(f) The Complaint must allege that the violation(s) set forth in the Complaint occurred not more than one (1) year prior to the date that the Complaint is filed with the Colorado Department of Education (CDE):
  - 2.07(2)(g) The signature and contact information (minimally, address and telephone number) for the complainant; and
  - 2.07(2)(h) Written verification in a cover letter accompanying the Complaint that a complete copy of the Complaint and any attachments have also been mailed, hand-delivered, or delivered by other secure method to the public education agency (i.e. a school district, BOCES, or the Charter School Institute) serving the child.

2.07(3) The Complaint, including any attachments, must be mailed, hand-delivered, or delivered by other secure method to the IDEA State Complaints:

Additionally, as noted in paragraph 2.07(2)(h) above, a complete copy of the Complaint, including any attachments, must also be mailed, hand-delivered, or delivered by other secure method to the public education agency (i.e. a school district, BOCES or the Charter School Institute) serving the child.

## 2.07(4) Complaints involving children with disabilities

2.07(4)(a) If the State Complaints Officer determines that the Complaint alleges a violation of the IDEA or its implementing regulations in 34 CFR Part 300, then the Complaint shall be processed through CDE's IDEA dispute resolution process. In these cases, the State Complaints Officer shall also have the authority to investigate and process a Complaint alleging improper use of seclusion and restraints in accordance with the timelines and procedures outlined in these rules.

2.07(4)(b) If the State Complaints Officer determines that the Complaint does not meet the criteria under section 2.07(4)(a), he or she shall refer the Complaint to the Restraint Complaints Officer (RCO) within five (5) calendar days of receiving the Complaint and shall notify the complainant in writing of this referral.

2.07(4)(c) Nothing in this subsection shall require the complainant to submit an additional Complaint directly to the RCO.

2.07(5) The Complaint shall be considered properly filed with the Department when it is received in CDE's Dispute Resolution Office and satisfies paragraph 2.07(2) above. A Complaint, once filed, will not be accepted for investigation if the CDE does not have jurisdiction (i.e., authority) to investigate; or if the Complaint does not set forth sufficient grounds on which to grant relief.

2.07(6) Within ten calendar (10) days of receipt of the Complaint, the RCO shall decide to accept or reject the Complaint for investigation and notify the complainant in writing. If the Complaint was sent via mail, the RCO's decision shall be postmarked by the 10th day. If the Complaint is accepted, the RCO shall:

2.07(6)(a) Notify the complainant of receipt and acceptance of the Complaint;

2.07(6)(b) Notify, by certified or overnight mail, the public education agency of each and every allegation contained in the Complaint together with a complete copy of the Complaint; and

<u>2.07(6)(c)</u> Initiate an investigation concerning the allegations contained in the Complaint.

#### 2.07(7) Complaint Timelines:

2.07(7)(a) Response: Within fifteen (15) calendar days of receiving the RCO's notification of the Complaint, the public education agency may file a Response to the Complaint allegations and provide information which it deems necessary or useful for the RCO to consider in conducting a thorough investigation. If the public education agency fails to timely respond to an allegation, the RCO may, in his/her sole discretion, deem the allegation admitted.

The Response is due by 5:00 p.m. on the date due. The public education agency shall provide any written Response to the RCO and also a complete copy of the Response, including any attachments, to the complainant unless doing so would violate relevant laws regarding confidentiality. The public education agency shall provide the RCO with a legible copy of the written tracking receipt which verifies that a complete copy of the Response, including any attachments, was sent by certified or overnight mail to the complainant.

2.07(7)(b) Reply: Within ten (10) calendar days of delivery of the response, the complainant may file a written Reply to the Response, including any attachments, in support of his/her position. The complainant shall provide any written Reply to the RCO at the address identified in paragraph 2.07(3), above, and also provide the RCO by 5:00 p.m. on the date due with written verification that a complete copy of the Reply, including any attachments, was also mailed or hand-delivered to the public education agency.

The Response and Reply must be delivered by 5:00 p.m. on the date due to the office of the RCO and not merely postmarked by the due date. If the Response or Reply is untimely, the RCO may, within his or her sole discretion, refuse to consider the late document.

2.07(7)(c) Timeline Extensions: If the RCO finds that exceptional circumstances exist with respect to a particular Complaint, the RCO may, in his or her sole discretion, extend for a reasonable period of time, any of the timelines set forth in these Complaint procedures. Any request and extension of a timeline must occur prior to expiration of the timeline and shall be documented in a written order issued by the RCO prior to the expiration of the timeline and mailed to the parties. The RCO does not have authority to extend the regulatory statute of limitations of one (1) year described in Section 2.07(2)(f) above.

2.07(7)(d) If one or more due dates in the process fall on a weekend or a state holiday, the due date shall be the next calendar day following a weekend or state holiday if the due date is on a weekend or state holiday.

#### 2.07(8) Complaint Investigations:

2.07(8)(a) The Complaint investigation may include, but is not limited to: an onsite investigation; request(s) that the complainant or public education agency provide additional information; and request(s) to review records in the possession of either party.

2.07(8)(b) Any time after a Complaint is filed and before the Complaint is resolved, the RCO may recommend a public education agency to undertake immediate action in an extraordinary situation when it is imperative to do so in order to protect the rights, health or safety of any student.

2.07(8)(c) The CDE, through the RCO, shall have sixty (60) calendar days from the date of receipt of the properly filed Complaint, to resolve the Complaint. The parties may mutually agree to extend the sixty (60) calendar day time limit in order to engage in voluntary mediation. Any extension of the Decision due date will be set by the RCO to a date certain as per section 2.07(7)(c), above.

#### 2.07(9) Complaint Resolution:

2.07(9)(a) The RCO shall issue a written decision which details the findings of fact and conclusions of law unless the issues have been previously resolved. Based upon a finding that a public education agency has failed substantially to comply with state laws and regulations for the use of restraint, the RCO will, as part of the resolution of the Complaint, make recommendations to the public education agency of remedial actions that may be taken in order to come into compliance with applicable law and regulations, (e.g., technical assistance and training activities).

2.07(9)(b) The RCO shall have no authority to require corrective action by the public education agency, including but not limited to compensatory education for the child who is the subject of the complaint, monetary reimbursement or attorney fees.

2.07(9)(c) The decision of the RCO shall be final.

# **Administering Medications to Students**

School personnel shall not administer prescription or nonprescription medications to students unless appropriate administration cannot reasonably be accomplished outside of school hours and the student's parent/guardian is not available to administer the medication during the school day.

Medication, other than medical marijuana, may be administered to students by school personnel whom a district school nurse has trained and delegated the task of administering such medication. For purposes of this policy, the term "medication" includes both prescription medication and nonprescription medication, but does not include medical marijuana. The administration of medical marijuana shall be as required by state law regarding the administration of medical marijuana to qualified students.

The term "nonprescription medication" includes but is not limited to over-the-counter medications, homeopathic and herbal medications, vitamins and nutritional supplements. Medication, other than medical marijuana, may be administered to students by the school health clerk or other school designee only when the following requirements are met:

- Medication shall be in the original properly labeled container. If it is a prescription medication, the student's name, name of the medication, dosage, how often it is to be administered, and name of the prescribing health care practitioner shall be printed on the container.
- 2. The school shall have received written permission to administer the medication from the student's health care practitioner with prescriptive authority under Colorado law.
- 3. The school shall have received written permission from the student's parent/guardian to administer the medication to the student and either:
  - a. written permission to administer the medication from the student's health care practitioner with prescriptive authority under Colorado law; or
  - b. a standing medical order, if the medication is an over-the-counter medication such as Advil or Tylenol.
- 3.4. The parent/guardian shall be responsible for providing all medication to be administered to the student.

#### Self-administration of medication for asthma, allergies or anaphylaxis

A student with asthma, <u>a food allergy, other</u> severe allergies, diabetes, or <u>otherrelated</u>, life-threatening conditions may possess and self-administer medication, other than medical marijuana, to treat such conditions. Self-administration of such medication may occur during school hours, at school-sponsored activities, or while in transit to and from school or a school-sponsored activity. Student possession and self-administration of such medication shall be in accordance with the regulation that accompanies this policy.

Authorization for a student to possess and self-administer medication to treat the student's asthma, <u>food or other</u> severe allergies, <u>anaphylaxis</u>, diabetes or other <u>related</u>, life-threatening condition may be limited or revoked by the school principal after consultation with a district school nurse, the school health clerk and the student's parent/guardian if the student demonstrates an inability to responsibly possess and self-administer such medication.

Sharing, borrowing or distribution of medication is prohibited. The student's authorization to self-administer medication may be revoked by the school principal after consultation with a district school nurse, the school health clerk and the student's parent/guardian and the student may be subject to disciplinary consequences, including suspension and/or expulsion, for violation of this policy.

#### Medical marijuana

The Board recognizes the Colorado General Assembly passed HB 16-1373 mandating school districts allow the administration of medical marijuana to students on school grounds under certain circumstances, so long as the school districts do not lose or will not have its federal funds reasonably jeopardized. The Board further recognizes that such state law, whether or not school districts have a corresponding policy, is contrary to federal law, which continues to categorize all forms of marijuana as a Schedule I controlled substance.

The Board strives to honor families' private medical decisions while maintaining a learning environment free of disruption and upholding its commitments to be a drug and alcohol-free environment. To accomplish these goals, the district permits the administration of medical marijuana to qualified students in accordance with state law during school hours if the administration cannot reasonably be accomplished outside of school hours, so long as the district will not lose federal funding as set forth below.

#### Definitions:

"Designated location" means a location identified in writing by the school district and may only include a location on the grounds of the school in which the student is enrolled, upon a school bus in Colorado, or at a school-sponsored event in Colorado;

"Permissible form of medical marijuana" means nonsmokeable products such as oils, tinctures, edible products or lotions that can be administered and fully ingested or absorbed in a short period of time;

"Primary caregiver" means the qualified student's parent, legal guardian or licensed medical professional; and

"Qualified student" means a student who holds a valid registration from the state of Colorado (license issued by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment) for the use of medical marijuana and for whom the administration of medical marijuana cannot reasonably be accomplished outside of school hours.

#### Permissible administration of medical marijuana to a qualified student

Any primary caregiver seeking access to school or district property, a school bus or school-sponsored event for purposes of this policy must comply with the district's policy and/or procedures concerning visitors to schools and all other applicable policies.

The primary caregiver shall be responsible for providing the permissible form of medical marijuana to be administered to the qualified student and only administer the medical marijuana in accordance with this policy and the approved Written Plan (Board Exhibit JLCD-E). After administering the permissible form of medical marijuana to the qualified student, the student's primary caregiver shall remove any remaining medical marijuana from the grounds of the school, district, school bus or school-sponsored event. A qualified

student's primary caregiver may administer a permissible form of medical marijuana to a qualified student in a designated location only if all of the following parameters have been met:

- 1. The qualified student's parent/guardian provided the school with a copy of the student's valid, current registration from the state of Colorado authorizing the student to receive medical marijuana.
- The primary caregiver creates a Written Plan (Board Exhibit JLCD-E), which
  receives approval by the district in its sole discretion that identifies the form,
  designated location(s), and any protocols regarding administration of a permissible
  form of medical marijuana to the qualified student.
- 3. Forms of medical marijuana not included in the definition of permissible form of medical marijuana may be proposed by the qualified student's primary parent/ guardian to the superintendent, or his/her designee, who may authorize such a request after consultation with appropriate personnel chosen by the district. Patches and other forms of administration that continue to deliver medical marijuana to a qualified student while at school may only be appropriate for students who receive ongoing adult assistance, or on a case-by-case basis, as determined by the district, when adequate protections against misuse may be made.
- 4. The district director of student services, or his/her designee, shall maintain a copy of each Written Plan (Board Exhibit JLCD-E).
- 5. The primary caregiver shall not administer the permissible form of medical marijuana in a manner that creates disruption to the educational environment or causes exposure to other students.

#### Additional parameters

School district personnel shall not administer, give advice related to, or possess medical marijuana in any form; nor shall they be responsible for verifying information related to the medical marijuana such as potency, dosage, and how often it should be administered.

This policy conveys no right to any student or to the student's parents/guardians or other primary caregiver to demand access to any general or particular location on school or district property, a school bus or at a school-sponsored event to administer medical marijuana.

This policy shall not apply to school grounds, school buses, or school-sponsored events located on federal property or any other location that prohibits marijuana on its property.

Qualified students shall not possess or self-administer medical marijuana.

Permission to administer medical marijuana to a qualified student on school grounds, school buses, or school-sponsored events may be limited or revoked if the qualified student and/or the student's primary caregiver violates this policy or demonstrates an inability to responsibly follow the parameters as outlined in this policy, the student is no longer an eligible student, or the district is no longer required by state law to permit a primary caregiver to possess and administer medical marijuana on school grounds, school buses, or at school-sponsored events.

Any student possession, use, distribution, sale or intoxication of marijuana inconsistent with this policy may be considered a violation of district policy concerning drug and alcohol involvement by students or other district policy and may subject the student to disciplinary consequences up to and including expulsion.

If the federal government indicates that the district's federal funds are jeopardized by this policy, the district declares that this policy shall be suspended immediately and that the administration of any form of medical marijuana to qualified students shall not be permitted on school grounds, upon a school bus or at a school-sponsored event. The district shall post notice of a policy suspension and prohibition in a conspicuous place on its website.

The parent or quardian shall provide a written statement that specifically describes the product and method of administration, and releases the district, its employees, agents, and assigns from any and all legal liability and financial responsibility to the eligible student and any third-party related to the possession and administration of medical marijuana to the eligible student on school property, school buses, or at school-sponsored events.

# Schedule of Student Fees (20178-20189)

Participation in courses, activities and acquisition of miscellaneous items may either be required or elective depending on individual student choice and academic pathway towards graduation. Fees related to courses, activities and miscellaneous items are required when a student's choice is elective or there are no additional options available for completion of a graduation requirement.

#### **ELEMENTARY LEVEL**

Students may be requested to bring specific, necessary supplies for their own use in the classroom. A district-wide common supply list will be provided to the parent. Schools may not require students to bring supplies to the class to be "pooled" or for shared use by the other students. Donations voluntarily shared will be considered optional.

# **School Board Meetings**

All meetings of three or more members of the Board at which any public business may be discussed or any formal action taken shall be open to the public at all times except for periods in which the Board is in executive session. All such meetings will be properly noticed and minutes will be taken and recorded as required by law.

No business may be conducted unless a quorum is present. A quorum shall consist of a simple majority (more than half) of the members serving on the Board.

A recording shall be made of regular and special meetings as required by law and at a minimum shall be an audio recording. Recordings shall be maintained for 90 days.

#### Regular meetings/study sessions

A regular business meeting of the Board of Education shall be held on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month and held at the Educational Services Center Board Room at 395 South Pratt Parkway, Longmont, Colorado 80501. Meetings typically begin at 76:00 p.m. and shall adjourn by 109:00 p.m. A regularly scheduled Study Session shall be held on the third Wednesday of every month, typically from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.

All meetings shall be held in the Board Room at the Educational Services Center unless otherwise established by the Board.

#### **Special meetings**

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Board president at any time and shall be called by the president upon the written request of a majority of the members.

The secretary of the Board shall be responsible for giving a written notice of any special meeting to each Board member at least 72 hours in advance of the meeting if mailed and 24 hours in advance if delivered or sent via email. The notice must contain time, place and purpose of the meeting and names of the members requesting the meeting.

Any member may waive notice of a special meeting at any time before, during or after such meeting, and attendance at a special meeting shall be deemed to be a waiver.

No business other than that stated in the notice of the meeting shall be transacted unless the item is reasonably related to the subject matter on the notice or an exigency exists. In addition, all members must be present and cast a unanimous vote to amend the agenda. Additional action may be taken if necessary due to the timeliness of the matter if it arose after the agenda was posted or is related to an item on the agenda.

#### Work sessions and retreats

The Board, as a decision-making body, is confronted with a continuing flow of problems, issues and needs that require action. While the Board is determined to expedite its business, it is also mindful of the importance of planning, brainstorming and thoughtful discussion without action. Therefore, from time-to-time, the Board may schedule work sessions or retreats, which shall be open to the public. No action shall be taken during such sessions. Public notice of the session, including the topics for discussion and study, shall be provided.
