Focus (if applicable)	Red Hawk Elementary is a Movement School with an emphasis on movement to increase engagement and academic outcomes.
Overview of Gifted Programming Options	Students in grades K-5, who have been identified in the program and qualify for advanced Reading and Math instruction, receive pull-out instruction with the G/T teacher, twice a week for each subject.
Enrichment Options	Students at Red Hawk attend Art, Music, Technology, P.E., and Mandarin classes, which are taught during the school day. Red Hawk students also have a wide variety of before- and after-school opportunities available to them, including: Student Council, Equations Math Club, VEX IQ Robotics, Community Garden Club, Choir & Musical Clubs, 100 Mile Club, Shakespeare in the Park, Technology Club, Chess Club, Odyssey of the Mind, Set Design & Stage Crew Club, Kendama Club, Spanish Club, and Sign Language Club.
Social/Emotional Support	G/T students at Red Hawk Elementary receive social/emotional support through their G/T classroom teacher, their general education classroom teacher, and the school counselor, which includes using our In-Focus Curriculum. The G/T classroom teacher addresses our affective goal of self-advocacy, along with other affective needs, by facilitating a beforeschool fifth grade discussion group, facilitating a book study on the <i>Survival Guide for Gifted Students</i> for students in grades 2-5, and for all G/T students - reflection and Growth Mindset activities, as well as goal-setting and multiple intelligence inventories.
Classroom Differentiation and Extensions	Classroom teachers use differentiation on a daily basis to meet the needs of all learners in their classrooms. Our students, including our gifted/talented students, are often given choices for assessments and assignments, are often placed in flexible ability groups, and work collaboratively with others to solve problems that reflect on real-world implications. Gifted/Talented Focus Classes in both Reading and Math are offered at Red Hawk Elementary, for grades K-5. Sixth grade math is offered as a separate, daily course to fifth grade students. Grade-level and specific content acceleration is done at Red Hawk, on a case-by-case basis
