

Use of School Vehicles by Community Groups

The general philosophy of the Board of Education is that transportation equipment purchased by the district is to be used primarily for school purposes. Nevertheless, it is the policy of the Board of Education to make available transportation vehicles for use by appropriate community groups to the extent that such use does not impinge upon or impair use for district purposes.

Among community groups that qualify for the use of school transportation equipment are those composed of citizens 65 years of age and older. Such groups shall be given special consideration as required by the statute relating to community use of school buses. As permitted by law, all groups shall be expected to pay the actual costs involved in the use of school transportation equipment.

Non-school use of school transportation equipment shall not be intermingled with student transportation, nor shall it interfere with normal district transportation operations.

Regulations for community use of school transportation equipment shall be developed by the administration and approved by the Board.
