

Career and Technical Education

Career and Technical Education (CTE) shall be available to high school students, grades 9-12, who are interested and can profit from job entry-level skill training in preparation for gainful employment or post-secondary continuation. Such programs shall be operated primarily under the auspices of the district's Career Development Center (CDC). Adult students may enroll at the Career Development Center (CDC) on a space-available basis. Adult students will pay tuition. Career and technical programs shall be designed to meet the employment needs of St. Vrain Valley School District RE-1J, Boulder County or the state of Colorado.

Those programs which have sufficient student and employment demand may be operated through the district's high schools independent of the CDC or with the CDC providing the advanced level of a program. CTE programs housed at CDC shall be considered an extension of the total course offering of each of the district's high schools and all courses successfully completed shall be counted towards high school graduation.

Students may enroll in CTE programs offered by neighboring school districts if approved by the principal. In such instances, the district may provide reasonable tuition costs.

Transportation between in-district attendance areas and CTE centers may be provided to students enrolled in vocational programs.
