Overview of Gifted and Talented	 At LHS, students identified as gifted and talented create a personalized Advance Learning Plan each school year. They meet with the GT site leader to monitor progress on their plan throughout the year. The <u>Gifted and Talented</u> program provides students with a G.T. Coordinator who is a support for them. Longmont High School will ensure gifted students' learning and growth through educational provisions and advocacy.Students are pulled in the fall to complete their Advanced Learning Plan and then receive monthly Google Forms as a check in with their G.T. Coordinator.
