<u>PURPOSE</u>

To update the Board of Education on 2023 Achievement and Growth data for all state assessment measures: CMAS (ELA, Math) and the SAT Suite of Assessments (SAT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 9).

BACKGROUND

Students in the St. Vrain Valley Schools completed 24,184 CMAS ELA and Math tests and 6,661 PSAT and SAT tests. An in-depth report was provided at the Board of Education Study Session on September 20, 2023.

Finances

PURPOSE

To provide the Board of Education with an update of the 2016 Bond activity.

BACKGROUND

Voters approved the 2016 \$260 million Bond program in November of 2016. With Bond proceeds and additional funding, the total Bond program value is \$318 million. To date, the District has opened over 250 additional classrooms and has performed various improvements to district facilities to deliver the 2016 Bond promise. The Bond program focused on projects to help mitigate capacity concerns in the Erie, Tri-Town, and Silver Creek feeders. Additional projects included in the Bond program address safety and security, enhancing educational programs, and building preservation items.

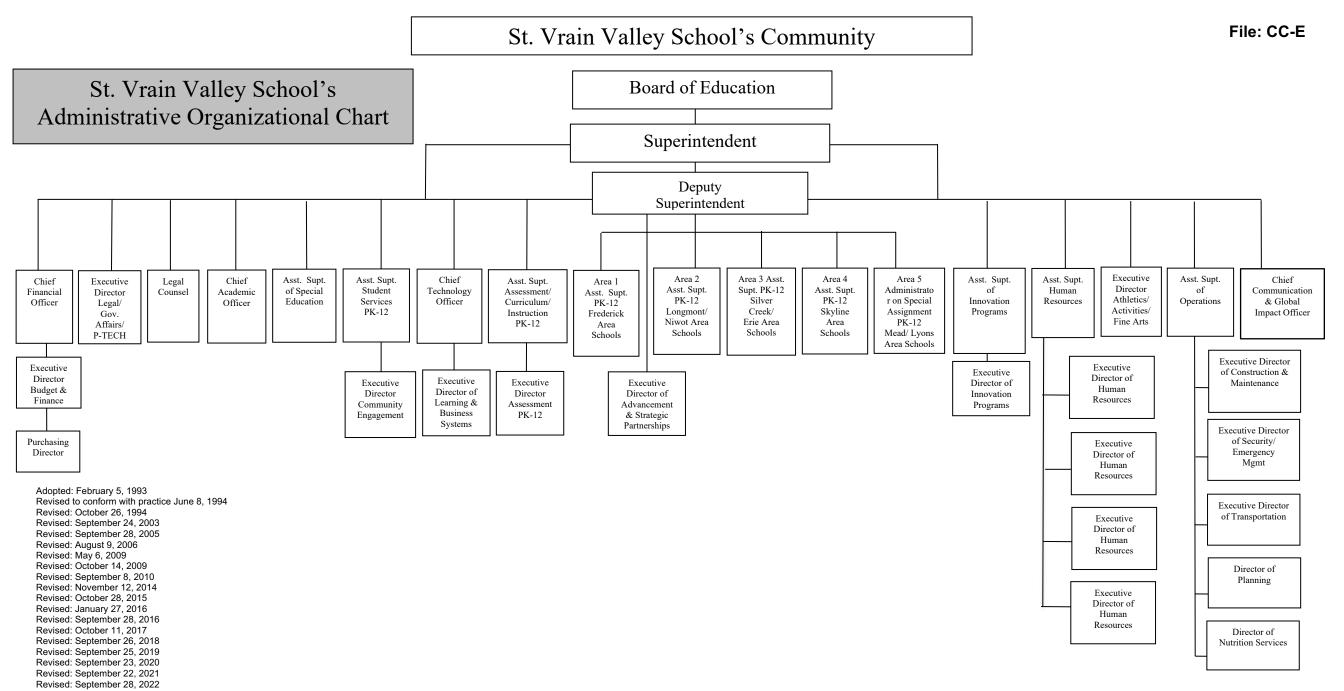
RECOMMENDATION

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Education approve Change Order for \$39,110 to the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC) agreement for the Modular Move Project at Soaring Heights PK-8 for a total contract value of \$178,104. Further, that the Board authorize Brian Lamer, Assistant Superintendent of Operations, to sign contract documents and initiate scope changes in accordance with Board of Education policy.

BACKGROUND

This Change Order includes additional scope to replace deck, stairs, and ramps to meet current code requirements.

The budget for the project has been established at \$200,000 as part of the Capital Reserve fund. This item is being brought forth to comply with Board policy FEH stating any items over \$99,999 must have Board approval.
