# **PURPOSE**

To provide the Board information regarding the new Sustainability internship program.

The Energy & Sustainability Department is currently engaged in an exciting partnership with the Innovation Center, co-leading a Student Sustainability Internship program this Fall 2025 semester. The team consists of the Energy & Sustainability Specialist, the Innovation Center's Internship Coordinator, and four high schoolers representing different schools and interests within the sustainability umbrella.

- 2. Shaffer Piersol (11th Grade, Niwot) -- Greenhouse Gas Intern

- 4. Hana Hylenski (12th Grade, Mead) -- Indoor Air Quality Intern

This is an informational session to discuss the internship, the impact and importance of these opportunities for our students and the hands-on work experience this has provided thus far.

# **BACKGROUND**

The overarching goal of this internship is for students to learn about sustainability work in the context of their own school district and community. By achieving a greater degree of sustainability expertise through hands-on work, interns can expect to leave this experience inspired, more aware of how sustainability professionals achieved their success, and with opportunities to think critically about sustainability in the context of St. Vrain Valley Schools through dynamic and engaging workplace tasks, culminating in a showcase of their research projects in December.
